

From the Pastor's Desk:



For a Catholic, there is nothing more precious than the Communion. Because we firmly believe that what is consecrated on the altar, what the priest gives to us at the time of communion, what we hold in our hand and what we consume is the body and the blood of Jesus. Communion is the most precious gift Jesus has given to us. When Jesus realized that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father, he felt so sad to leave his disciples - the ones whom he loved so much in this world. He wanted to remain with them forever. And that is the reason he transformed the bread and wine into his own body and blood.

Commenting on the sacredness of this body and blood of Jesus, St. Paul in 1 Cor 12:27-29 says, "Therefore, if anyone eats of the bread or drinks from the cup of the Lord unworthily, he sins against the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself." Very strong words from St. Paul regarding the internal disposition we need to have prior to receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus and rightly so.

In the mass we encounter Christ in the assembly gathered for prayer, in the celebrating priest, in the word of God that is proclaimed, and in the Body and Blood of Christ broken and poured out for us. However, the most important moment of our encounter with the Body of Christ happens at the time of Communion. It is in fact the culmination of our Eucharistic celebration. That is why silent prayer following Communion is strongly encouraged. In this personal and intimate encounter with the Lord, the person receives graces and blessings to face the day that lies ahead. Unfortunately in our church I see some people who receive communion not showing proper respect and reverence to the Eucharist. Some of them just prior to receiving communion wave, greet and embrace others and then immediately turn and show their hands to receive the communion from the ministers. Some others immediately after receiving communion greet others and loudly talk to others. Both these behaviors are in fact disrespect to the Eucharist that the person has just received. In addition to being a distraction to people who prefer to spend time in prayer they are also bad example to others particularly to children. Kindly refrain from such behavior. May we not do anything that in any way show disrespect to the Eucharist.





Nota de nuestro pastor

Para un Católico, no hay nada más precioso que la Comunión, porque creemos firmemente que lo que está consagrado en el altar, lo que el Sacerdote nos da en el momento de la

Comunión, lo que tenemos en nuestras manos y lo que consumimos, es el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús. La Comunión es el regalo máspreciado que Dios nos ha dado. Cuando Jesús se dio cuenta que había llegado el momento de dejar este mundo e ir al padre, se sintió tan triste por dejar a sus discípulos – a los cuales amaba tanto en este mundo. Quería permanecer con ellos para siempre. Y esa es la razón por la cual transformó el pan y el vino en su propio Cuerpo y Sangre.

Comentando sobre la santidad de este Cuerpo y Sangre de Jesús, dice San Pablo en I Cor II:27-29, "Por lo tanto, el que come el pan o bebe la copa del Señor indignamente peca contra el cuerpo y la sangre de Señor. Cada uno pues, examine su conciencia y luego podrá comer el pan y beber de la copa. El que come y bebe indignamente, come y bebe su propia condenación por no reconocer el cuerpo." Palabras muy fuertes de San Pablo en cuanto a la disposición interna que necesitamos tener antes de recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús y con mucha razón.

En la Misa podemos encontrar a Cristo en la Asamblea que se reúne para rezar, en el Sacerdote Celebrante, en la Palabra de Dios que se proclama, y en el Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo quebrado y derramada por nosotros. Sin embargo, el momento más importante de nuestro encuentro con el Cuerpo de Cristo sucede en el momento de la Comunión. De hecho es la culminación de nuestra celebración Eucarística. Por esta razón se recomienda una oración en silencio después de la Comunión. En este encuentro personal e íntimo con el Señor, la persona recibe gracias y bendiciones para afrontar el día que se avecina.

Lamentablemente en nuestra Iglesia veo algunas personas que reciben la Comunión y no muestran respeto y reverencia a la Eucaristía. Algunos de ellos justo antes de recibir la Comunión, saludan y abrazan a otros e inmediatamente giran y muestran sus manos para recibir la Comunión de los ministros. Algunos otros inmediatamente después de recibir la Comunión saludan a otros y hablan en voz alta con los demás. Ambos de estos comportamientos son de hecho falta de respeto a la Eucaristía que acaban de recibir. Además de ser una distracción para quienes prefieren pasar tiempo en oración, también son mal ejemplo a los demás, particularmente a los niños. Les pedimos abstenerse de tal comportamiento. Que no hagamos nada que de alguna manera muestre falta de respeto a la Eucaristía.

Vatican Corner

continued ... Prior to 1965, the Latin response: "ET cum spiritu tuo," which literally means "And with your spirit," when translated into the English liturgy became "And also with you." The translation was thought to convey the same meaning but be more straightforward. The liturgists of the English translation commission (ICEL) burned the midnight oil as they debated how best to achieve a style appropriate to English usage. How to deal with the long periodic sentences that gave the Latin its characteristic rhythm? The ICEL decided to break the sentences down into shorter components. A revised Latin text of the Mass was released in 1969 and its full English translation by the ICEL was prepared and released in 1970. Considering the pressures, it was remarkable that so much was achieved. Nevertheless, when the first English translations came out, the bishops of England and Wales were unhappy and were joined with the Scots, Irish and Australians to turn out their own partial version of the English translation. Complaints were sent to Pope Paul VI that the English, French, German and Spanish vernacular translations were watered down and endangering church doctrine. Nonetheless, that first English translation was used with minor changes until November 2011. Everyone concerned with the translation process recognized the need for improvement. A second edition of the Latin texts came out in 1975 and the ICEL began translation work in 1983 to produce a second English translation of the Mass. The hope was to produce a more poetic translation. That second version had a heightened style but was also criticized for not being sufficiently literal. It barely pass the 2/3 majority vote needed by the American bishops conference, but went on to be approved by all 11 of the English-speaking conferences of bishops and was sent to Rome for approval in 1998. However, in 2001 the Vatican issued new instructions to be used on the translation of Latin text which called for a strict literal translation and a more elevated tone. It was a major reform to the vernacular reform. Pope John Paul II then created a small group of bishops to oversee English translations. Based on the new translation rules, The Vatican rejected and shelved the 1998 English translation of the Mass that had been worked on for 13 years by so many people. That work has never been seen by the English-speaking world at large. The ICEL was disbanded and then recreated with new translators, who began work on a new English translation of the Mass. This new more literal English translation was completed and began use on the First Sunday of Advent 2011. In addition to the retranslated response: "And with your spirit," many of the people's parts, along with all of the prayers proclaimed by the priest, have changed significantly to follow Latin word order and grammar. Lost in translation, or a translation lost?




