

United in faith and guided by the Holy Spirit

From the Pastor's Desk:

Yakov Smirnoff is a Comedian from Russia. When he first came to the United States from Russia he was not prepared for the incredible variety of instant products available in American

grocery stores. He says, "On my first shopping trip with my friend, I saw milk powder; you just add hot water, and you get milk. Then I saw orange powder; you just add water, and you get orange juice. And then I saw baby powder, and I thought to myself, 'what a country, you add water to a tin of powder and get a baby!" Smirnoff was joking, but many non-Catholic Christian denominations make these assumptions seriously about instant Christian transformation, leading to eternal salvation. According to this belief, when someone surrenders his or her life to Christ, accepts him as his or her personal God and Savior and confesses his or her sins to him there is an immediate, substantive, in-depth, miraculous change in habits, attitudes, and character and he or she becomes a Christian, eligible for eternal salvation. Unfortunately, there is no such Christian powder and disciples of Jesus Christ are not instantly born. They are slowly raised through many trials, suffering, and temptations. They are saved by their faithful and lifelong cooperation with the grace of God given for doing good and avoiding evil. In today's Gospel, Jesus explains what his disciples should do: "Deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me." [Adapted from James Emery White, Rethinking the Church, (Baker, 1997), p. 55-57.]

English essayist Charles Lamb was once involved in a discussion on the question of who the greatest literary genius of all time had been. Two names finally emerged: William Shakespeare and Jesus of Nazareth. Lamb put an end to the debate when he said: "I'll tell you the difference between these two men. If Shakespeare walked into this room right now, we would all rise to greet him, but if Christ came in, we would all fall down and worship." There is the essential difference between the Man from Nazareth and all the other great people you and I can think of. Our attitude to Christianity and ourselves basically depends on who do we think Jesus is? In plain words, who is Jesus for you?

Nota de nuestro pastor:

Yakov Smirnoff es un comediante de Rusia. Cuando llegó de Rusia a los Estados Unidos por primera vez, no estaba preparado para la increíble variedad de productos instantáneos disponibles en tiendas americanas. Él dice: "en mi primer viaje de compras con mi amiga, vi leche en polvo; usted apenas agrega el agua caliente, y obtiene la leche. Luego vi polvo anaranjado; apenas agregas el agua, y obtienes jugo de naranja. Y entonces vi polvo de bebé, y yo pensé, 'que país, añades agua a una lata de polvo y tienes un bebé!" Smirnoff estaba bromeando, pero muchas denominaciones Cristianas no-Católicas hacen estas suposiciones seriamente sobre la transformación cristiana instantánea, que conduce a la salvación eterna. Según esta creencia, cuando alguien entrega su vida a Cristo, lo acepta como su Dios personal y Salvador, y le confiesa sus pecados, hay un cambio inmediato, milagroso, en los hábitos, actitudes y carácter, y él o ella se convierte en un Cristiano, elegible para la salvación eterna. Desafortunadamente, no hay tal polvo Cristiano y los discípulos de Jesucristo no nacen al instante. Ellos lentamente crecen a través de muchas pruebas, sufrimientos y tentaciones. Ellos son salvados por su fiel y permanente cooperación con la gracia de Dios dada para hacer el bien y evitar el mal. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús explica lo que deben hacer sus discípulos: "Niéguese a sí mismo, tome su cruz y sígame". El ensayista Inglés Charles Lamb participó en una discusión sobre la cuestión de quién había sido el mayor genio literario de todos los tiempos. Finalmente surgieron dos nombres: William Shakespeare y Jesús de Nazaret. Lamb puso fin al debate cuando dijo: "te diré la diferencia entre estos dos hombres. Si Shakespeare entra en esta habitación ahora mismo, todos nos pondríamos de pie para saludarlo, pero si Cristo llegara, todos caeríamos para adorarle". Hay una diferencia esencial entre el Hombre de Nazaret y todas las grandes personas que tú y yo pudiéramos pensar. Nuestra actitud al Cristianismo y hacia nosotros mismos depende básicamente de quién creemos que Jesús es? En palabras sencillas, quién es Jesús para ti?



I am sure I drive my kids crazy! When they fail to do, over and over again, that which I have asked them to do, they continue to say, "I'm sorry," to which I say, "No, you're

not!" They look at me with that look that says, "How can you not accept my apology? Who doesn't accept 'I'm sorry?'" Then I say to them, "If you were truly sorry you would change and do what I asked you to do!" Of course, their response almost always is, "I forgot!" Forgot? How does someone forget something that has been asked of him or her several times in the course of day? Well, if I drive them crazy, I am sure it is because they drove me crazy first! VATICAN CORNER

continued... Last December 2014, Pope Francis joined leaders of the world's religious faiths to sign a

declaration aimed at ending modern slavery. That event has no parallel in history and was organized by billionaire Andrew Forrest's Global Freedom Network, one of a number of entities controlled by Mr. Forrest aimed at ending human trafficking and slavery. It took a tremendous amount of diplomatic skill, and a commitment of real money, and Mr. Forrest ranks the signing as amongst his greatest and most difficult achievement. The religious leaders and the Network committed to eradicate slavery by 2020 which looks




very ambitious, since 29 to 36 million people are trapped in slavery of some kind. The broad definition of slavery used by the organizations includes forced labor, forced marriages and sex-trafficking. Australian mining tycoon Andrew Forrest is a bundle of contradictions. He is a man who professes his love for Aboriginal people, but plays tough when they stand in the way of his mines. He is a free-marketeer who went close to arguing for an industry cartel, and a generous philanthropist, who has shackled his charities to his commercial interests. From mining claims discarded by other companies he built Fortescue Metals Group into the fourth largest iron exporter in the world. He has a genuine social conscience and has dedicated considerable time and personal resources to issues such as Indigenous disadvantage. He has pledged to give away nearly all his wealth during his lifetime. But critics say his charities over-promise and under-deliver.

In a startling turn of events, in August, 2015, the Vatican has accused Andrew Forrest of exploiting the Pope as it distances itself from his anti-slavery campaign, which it had pledged to support. In a scathing statement, one of Pope Francis's principal aides, Bishop Marcelo Sánchez Sorondo, told reporters the Vatican had walked away from Mr Forrest's campaign to end slavery because it felt the Pope had been exploited. "We do not want to be used, a businessman has the right to make money but not by using the Pope." A spokesman from Mr. Forrest's charity, the Walk Free Foundation, defended the initiative. "At absolutely no point in time was this a business initiative. Walk Free Foundation provided all the funding to the Global Freedom Network when the (declaration) was achieved this was over 1 million euros in direct funding in addition to substantial other costs. Walk Free Foundation continues to proudly support the Global Freedom Network."

Human trafficking experts like Dr. Anne Gallagher, who has consulted to the United Nations, believes Mr. Forrest's initiatives only offer simplistic solutions to deep-seated problems. "The trouble with the approach is that it assumes this problem can be fixed by pushing governments, by getting a lot of young people to sign up to petitions that go to corporations," Dr. Gallagher said. Mr. Forrest defended the charity, which he said was forcing governments across the world to confront human trafficking in their countries. "When (critics) can come up with more than criticism we'll really applaud because then they will be helping US." Sources: theguardian.com, abc.net.au, cathnews.com, smh.com.au
