From the Pastor's Desk:

In Greek

mythology, the Sirens are creatures with the heads of beautiful women and the bodies of attractive birds. They lived on an island (Sirenum scopuli; three small rocky islands) and, with the irresistible charm of their song, they lured mariners to their destruction on the rocks

surrounding their island (Homer's Odyssey XII, 39-54, 158-200; Virgil's Aeneid V, 42-44; Ovid's Metamorphoses XIV, 88-89). They sang so sweetly that all who sailed near their home in the sea were fascinated and drawn to the shore only to be destroyed. When Odysseus, the hero in the Odyssey, passed that enchanted spot he had himself tied to the mast and put wax in the ears of his comrades, so that they might not hear the luring and bewitching strains. But King Tharsius chose a better way. He took the great Greek singer and lyrist Orpheus along with him. Orpheus took out his lyre and sang a song so clear and ringing that it drowned the sound of those lovely, fatal voices of sirens. The best way to break the charm of this world's alluring voices during Lent is not trying to shut out the music by plugging our ears, but to have our hearts and lives filled with the sweeter music of prayer, penance, the word of God, self-control, and acts of charity. Then temptations will have no power over us.

The Church was packed with the faithful eager to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday. Pat, Father Kelly's sacristan, offered to help. "OK," said Father, "now these are the words you say: 'Remember, man, you are dust, and unto dust you shall return." Pat prepared to start at the opposite end of the communion rail. (This was in the old days, as you can realize.) But Pat came hurrying over to Father: "Father, what are those words again?" Father told him, Pat went back to his station, but in a moment he was back, asking for the words, which Father repeated. When Pat came back the third time Father exploded: "You are a dummy and you'll always be a dummy." Pat didn't come back but when the padre and the sacristan came close to each other at the middle the priest was dumbfounded to hear the words Pat was saying: "You are a dummy and you'll always be a dummy"

A comical, but illustrative, story shows us how adept we are at rationalizing our actions: A very overweight man decided that it was time to shed a few pounds. He went on a new diet and took it seriously. He even changed his usual driving route to the office in order to avoid his favorite bakery. One morning, however, he arrived at the office carrying a large, sugar-coated coffee cake. His office mates roundly chided him, but he only smiled, shrugged his shoulders and said, "What could I do? This is a very special cake. This morning, from force of habit, I accidentally drove by my favorite bakery. There in the window were trays of the most delicious goodies. I felt that it was no accident that I happened to pass by, so I prayed, 'Lord, if you really want me to have one of these delicious coffee cakes, let me find a parking place in front of the bakery.' Sure enough, on the ninth trip around the block, there it was!"

y los cuerpos de aves atractivas. Vivían en una isla (Sirenum scopuli; tres pequeñas islas rocosas) y, con el irresistible encanto de su canción, atraían a los marineros hacia su destrucción en las rocas alrededor de su isla (Odisea de Homero XII, 39-54, 158-200; Aeneid V de Virgilio, 42-44; Metamorfosis de Ovid XIV, 88-89). Cantaban tan dulcemente que todos los que navegaban cerca de su casa en el mar quedaban fascinados y eran atraídos hacia la costa sólo para ser destruidos. Cuando Odysseus, el héroe en la Odisea, pasó ese punto encantado, él se ató al mástil y puso cera en los oídos de sus compañeros para que no pudieran oír los cantos atractivos y fascinantes. Pero el Rey Tharsius escogió una mejor manera. Llevó al gran cantante griego y compositor Orfeo con él. Orfeo tomó su lira y cantó una canción tan clara que ahogó el sonido de esas voces encantadoras y fatales de las sirenas. La mejor manera de romper el encanto de voces seductoras de este mundo durante la Cuaresma no es de tratar de ahogar la música tapando nuestros oídos, sino que llenar nuestros corazones y vidas con la más dulce música de oración, penitencia, la Palabra de Dios, autocontrol y actos de caridad. Entonces las tentaciones no tendrán ningún poder sobre nosotros.

La Iglesia estaba llena de fieles deseosos de recibir las cenizas el Miércoles de Ceniza. Pat, el Sacristán del padre Kelly, se ofreció a ayudar. "Bien," dijo padre, "ahora estas son las palabras que dices: ' recuerda, hombre, polvo eres y polvo volverás a ser." Pat se preparó para comenzar en el extremo opuesto del comulgatorio. (Esto era en los viejos tiempos, como usted puede darse cuenta). Pero Pat vino apresurándose hacia el Padre: "Padre, ¿cuáles son esas palabras otra vez?" el Padre le dijo. Pat regresó a su estación, pero en un momento él regresó pidiendo las palabras, y el Padre se las repitió. Cuando Pat volvió la tercera vez, el Padre explotó: "eres un tonto y siempre vas a ser un tonto". Pat no volvió, pero cuando el Padre y el Sacristán se acercaron el uno al otro en el centro, el Sacerdote estaba estupefacto al escuchar las palabras de Pat que estaba diciendo: "eres un tonto y siempre vas a ser un tonto"

Una historia cómica, pero ilustrativa, nos muestra que tan adepto somos para racionalizar nuestras acciones: un hombre de mucho sobrepeso decidió que era tiempo para quitarse unas pocas libras. Comenzó una dieta nueva y la tomó en serio. Incluso cambió su ruta habitual para conducir a la oficina y evitar su panadería favorita. Una mañana, sin embargo, él llegó a la oficina con un pastel de café grande, recubierto de azúcar. Sus compañeros de oficina le reprendieron enérgicamente, pero él sólo sonrió, encogió de hombros y dijo, "¿Qué puedo hacer? Este es un pastel muy especial. Esta mañana, por fuerza de costumbre, yo accidentalmente conduje por mi panadería favorita. Ahí en la ventana había bandejas de las golosinas más deliciosas. No me pareció coincidencia de que se me ocurriera pasar por, así que oré, 'Señor, si realmente quieres que tenga una de estas deliciosas tortas de café, déjame encontrar una espacio de estacionamiento en frente de la panadería.' Efectivamente, en el noveno viaje alrededor de la cuadra, allí estaba!"





VATICAN CORNER

continued...Pope Francis saw first-hand the mafia side

of the Order of the Knights of Malta when in 2008 senior Knights made a failed attempt to remove him as Archbishop of Buenos Aires and replace him with a bishop who was the Knight's chaplain in Argentina. A similar removal action was attempted internally within the Knights of Malta in early December, 2016 to the figurehead of the Germanspeaking reformist Knights - Albrecht Freiherr von Boeselager, a harsh critic of Grand Master Festing and his chief rival. Festing, emboldened by American Cardinal Leo Burke undertook the removal action of Boeselager. Cardinal Burke is the same Cardinal Burke who has been the outspoken



critic and leader of the anti-Pope Francis crusade from the start. Burke was demoted by Francis from head of the Vatican's Supreme Court to the patron of the Order of the Knights of Malta in 2014. That new generally ceremonial job includes being the communication link between the Order and Pope Francis. Cardinal Burke while in his new job has continued to voice his concerns about the Church's leadership and in recent months has opening challenged Francis. With Cardinal Burke encouragement, Grand Master Festing began removal of Boeselager, his real irritant. Grounds for the removal were apparently manufactured and Boeselarger claims his removal was only because he is a liberal Catholic. Boeselarger refused to resign and was fired claiming it was an illegal and unconstitutional action. There was a false assertion that Pope Francis wanted Boeselager removed from office, which the Vatican denied several times. Pope Francis stepped in and asserted this authority over a "lay religious Order" and announced his decision to have an investigation conducted. A commission was formed to investigate the circumstances surrounding Boeselager's removal. Festing sent a message to Pope Francis that the removal was an internal matter, and that the investigation was unacceptable to the Order. There was a tense stand-off, but on January 24, 2017 when the investigation found serious dysfunction in the Order's leadership and that reform was needed, Pope Francis asked Festing to resign as Grand Master and he agreed to do so. Cardinal Burke met with Festing and tried in vain to persuade him to rescind his resignation. Pope Francis appointed an interim delegate who he said would strive to "renew the spirituality of the Order, specifically of those members who take vows." He added that the delegate would be "my sole spokesman..." thus ending Cardinal Burke's role at the Order for now. The actions of Pope Francis were considered by some to be a hostile takeover and probably resulted in the posters of the scowling Pope found on the walls in Rome. Pope Francis assured the Order of his respect for its sovereignty and Boeselager was reinstated, and the Knights said that their charitable programs, humanitarian and socio-medical work in 120 countries will continue despite the recent distractions in their internal government. Jesus will show us the way to observe a Lent that will soon bring forth great Easter fruit.
